VISA AND VACCINATION

All participants must enter Malaysia with a Visa With Reference (VWR). Participants in the programme will receive a copy of the approval letter from HDC. Participants are required to obtain the VWR stamping from the nearest Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission. Participants are required to be vaccinated for Covid-19 prior to arriving in Malaysia.

Participants from countries listed in https://www.imi.gov.my/index.php/en/-mainservices/visa/visa-requirement-by-country/ are required to take a mandatory vaccination for Yellow Fever Vaccine Certificate at least ten (10) days prior to their departure to Malaysia. Yellow Fever Vaccine Certificate certificate is required upon landing in Malaysia.
